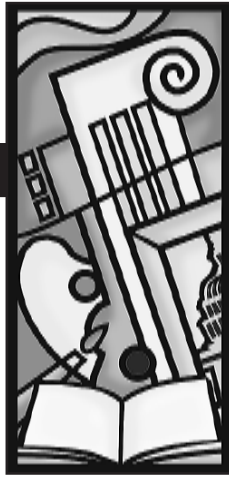

Congratulations, 2008 History Heroes!

The 13th Annual History Hero Awards were presented on History Day, February 21, 2008, in the Norman L. Fagan West Virginia State Theater, The Cultural Center, Charleston, by Robert Conte, Chairman of the West Virginia Archives and History Commission, and Kay Goodwin, Secretary of Education and the Arts. History Heroes are individuals who go beyond the call of duty to ensure the success of local history, genealogy, preservation and museum organizations. The contributions of History Heroes have been recognized during History Day programs from 1997 through 2008, with most honorees present to receive their awards. Their combined work makes a statement most deserving of this statewide public recognition. These recipients have been recognized for their grassroots efforts, years of dedicated behind-the-scenes services, or for a significant contribution such as preserving a site or collection, or publishing a work of family or local history. Recipients were nominated by groups and organizations working on behalf of the preservation and dis-

West Virginia Genealogical Society Library

The West Virginia Genealogical Society (WVGS) has a research library open to the public on Mondays and Wednesday from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., and on Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The library has information on all West Virginia counties, primarily for those counties for which printed transcriptions of records are available; some out-of-state materials, mostly Virginia and Ohio; and family histories. Society members staff the library and assist patrons in using the library's resources and in solving research problems. WVGS holds its regular

meetings and an annual genealogy fair in the library building. The library may be reached by phone at (304) 965-1179, and although an answering machine is available, long-distance calls can not be returned. The physical address of the library is 5153 North Elk River Road in Blue Creek, WV (on Route 119, just above the four-way stop in Elkview). Letters requesting research help are accepted, by regular mail sent to WVGS, P.O. Box 249, Elkview, WV 25071, or by e-mail to ebw104@juno.com. The only fees requested are \$.15 per photocopied page and/

or postage (unless a self-addressed, stamped envelope is included).

Planning a Cemetery Cleanup?

April and May are the traditional pre-Memorial Day cleanup period for cemeteries. If you are planning a trip to a family, church or community burial ground, keep in mind that care should be taken to preserve stones and other grave markers. While you are there, consider taking the following extra steps to preserve the memory of those buried in the cemetery, and to help relatives find the burial places of their ancestors:

- Create or update a cemetery listing.
- Write down driving directions and contact information.
- Print off a copy of the West Virginia State Historic Preservation Office Cemetery Survey form (<http://www.wvculture.org/shpo/cemeteries.html>), fill it in and send it to SHPO for inclusion in their file.
- Mail or e-mail a copy of the cemetery listing or the Survey form to Susan Scouras, Archives and History Library, for the Library's
