**EPHRAIM BENONI HALL**, one of fourteen children, was born on August 29, 1822 to Rynear Hall and Susannah (Lowe) Hall in Middletown, Virginia, which is now Fairmont, West Virginia. He practiced law in Middletown after receiving his degree from Rector College, Pruntytown, [West] Virginia. He married Ella Sophia Jones on May 10, 1854.

He was a member of the First and Second Wheeling Conventions and became the

Attorney General of West Virginia in 1865. In 1872, because of his wife's failing health,

he resigned his position as Tenth Judicial Circuit Judge of Jefferson, Berkeley and

Morgan Counties, to move to Santa Barbara, California. He continued to practice law

and was active in church. He died on January 16, 1898 at the age of 75.
