Henry H. Masters, of Pendleton County (now in West Virginia), was born about 1815. He was a lawyer and lived at Franklin. He represented the county in the State Convention and voted against secession on April 4 and again on April 17. He became judge of Pendleton County in 1879, and died in 1892.
