James A. Williamson:

James A. Williamson was born about 1822 in Virginia and was trained as a physician.

Williamson was the third doctor to practice in Elizabeth, county seat of Wirt County.

(Cochran) After Virginia seceded from the union, Williamson was sent to represent Wirt

County at the Second Wheeling Convention; this seems to have been his only entry into

public service. After the Civil War, Williamson moved his practice to Parkersburg where

he died in 1908. (Kreidler)
