On January 17, 1885, James Arthur Jackson, who served as West Virginia Supreme Court librarian from 1925 to 1965, was born in Coal Valley.

What would you ask the sender or receiver about the contents of this message? What resources could you use to learn more about former West Virginia Supreme Court librarian James Arthur Jackson?
