Carter Will Name Cyrus R. Vance as New Secretary of State; Assails Steel Boosts



Cyrtas Robert Vance, named by President-elect Jimmy Carter on Friday to become secretary of state, is a Clarkshurg native who developed an early interest in legal malters while growing up here.

"We used to speed Sandays with the John W. Davises." Vance once said in an interview. "I used to browse in Mr. Davis' law library. Vance said Davis would poselegal problems for him. Vance, who was in grade school then, would spend hours researching the problem in the law library before giving Davis his "optuion."

Vance was born on St. Patrick's Day in 1917, the son of John Carl and Arny Roberts Vance. The Impily was of Webb descent_add Cyrus was the fourth generation of the family in Christoburg. His or e a t-grand-ather. Cyrus Vance, had been mayor and his grandiather. John Vance, was a member of the first legislature at Wheeling, after the state split from Varginia.

Vance lived in Charksburg only about aix months before his father, an insurance executive, moved the family to bronaville, N.Y. His father died of preornonia when the boy was 5 years old and the family returned in Charksburg, where Cyrus attended grade action.

Later Vance attended Kent School, a private prep school in Connecticut, and was graduated in 1939 from Yale University with a degree in economics. He was graduated from the Yale Law School with honors in 1942 Vance entered government service in 1957 and served until 1960 as special counsel to the preparedness investigating subcommittee of the Senate Committee on Armed Services. He later advised the Special Senate Committee on Space and Astronautics, chaired by then Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson, D-Texas. Vance developed a reputation for thorough work and research while in Washington. His speed reading habits helped him to keep up with workloads that may have defeated others. "He has a photographic memory," said his mother, "I remember one time we took a motor trip out West. Bob had been on the same route years before - and he remembered every turn in the road before we came to it." Vance has been associated with a New York law firm and recently has been a ranking foreign policy, adviser to Carler. "I feel every person who has rlain advantages should some thoungt to public Service," Vance said in a 1963 interview. "I've always felt very strongly that all of us have an obligation, a duty to perform."
